European Parliament resolution of 12 March 1969 on the election of Members of the European Parliament by direct universal suffrage

The European Parliament,

- whereas Article 138(3) of the Treaty establishing the EEC provides that Parliament shall be elected by direct universal suffrage,
- whereas the European Parliament submitted a draft (1) on 17 May 1960 providing for elections by direct universal suffrage,
- whereas the Council has not yet taken any decision on the proposal, and whereas it abandoned consideration thereof six years ago,

Instructs its President to invite the Council to act without further delay on Parliament's proposal, as it is required to do under the Treaty, and to draw the Council's attention to the provisions of the first and second paragraphs of Article 175.
