## Archives Department — File Note (Brussels, 28 November 1975)

On 28 November 1975, we were informed of the following, in a telephone conversation with Mr Feipel:

The Committee of Permanent Representatives Preparatory Group was set up in October 1975 on a proposal from the COREPER President. The President informed his colleagues of his wish verbally and they agreed.

The Group is composed of members of the Permanent Representations. It meets before the actual COREPER meeting, finalises the agendas and the list of A items for the Council, and reviews Summaries of Council Decisions.

The Group is also known as the Antici Group.
