Interview with Pierre Pescatore: the Delegation of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg to Val Duchesse (Luxembourg, 10 September 2003)

[Étienne Deschamps] Who served on the Delegation of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg to Val Duchesse?

[Pierre Pescatore] The Head of Delegation was Lambert Schaus; then in the 'Common Market' Group there was Albert Duhr, a Foreign Ministry official, from the Foreign Trade Section. In the 'Atomic Group' there was an engineer from ARBED, since the Government had no one on its staff capable of assessing atomic issues. ARBED was more far-sighted and better equipped. It put an engineer at the disposal of the Government, and that explains why Luxembourg played no more than an observer's role in Euratom, not even in its final structure. All this was abolished when the Treaties were subsequently merged, something which was of greater benefit to our country.
