Guy de Muysen

Born on 20 June 1926 in Wiltz.

- Completed studies in Law and Economics in France, the United Kingdom and the United States.
- Doctor of Law; in 1956 he joined the Political Affairs section of the Luxembourg Foreign Ministry.
- In 1961, he changed section and spent eight years working in the area of International Economic Relations.
- In 1969, he left the Foreign Ministry for the post of Secretary and Head of Cabinet of Grand Duke Jean. In 1970, he became Marshal of the Grand Ducal Court, a post he held for twelve years.
- In 1981, Guy de Muysen returned to the Foreign Ministry and was appointed Ambassador in Moscow for the Soviet Union, Poland, Finland and Mongolia.
- In 1986, he was appointed Ambassador to Belgium and Permanent Representative to the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (NATO) until he ended his diplomatic career in 1991.
