**Caption:** On 1 April 1981, the Secretary-General of Western European Union (WEU) circulates the draft reply by the British delegation to the WEU Council to the question put by Sir Frederic Bennett, a British member of the WEU Assembly, on the measures that WEU member countries have taken or are contemplating taking to assist the Afghan resistance movements. Frederic Bennett particularly raises the question of deliveries of weapons to the resistance movements. The Council, while recognising the Afghan resistance's need for weapons, remains cautious and considers that it would not be helpful to give a specific answer to the question so as to avoid providing any information that might help identify supply sources.

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## Written question 225

Would the Council indicate what measures W.E.U. member countries have taken or are contemplating taking to assist the Afghan resistance movements?

Have some of these countries delivered, or are they planning to deliver, the weapons which the resistance movements urgently require?

### Draft reply

The member countries of W.E.U. admire the courageous opposition of the Afghan people to the Soviet invasion of their country. They recognise that those forced to defend their freedom against 85,000 Soviet troops need arms.

It would not be helpful to give a specific answer to this question. However, to the extent that some arms may be reaching the resistance, it would not be desirable to make any comment that might help to identify the sources of supply.

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
