Reply by the Council

The W.E.U. member countries recognise in the Afghan people's resistance an essential factor in the crisis brought about by the Soviet military intervention. They consider that any true political settlement of this crisis must take this reality into account.

Naturally, the W.E.U. member countries are concerned to act at the level where they could be effective, namely by organising international humanitarian aid to the peoples of Afghanistan driven from their country by the hunger and fighting.
