The following is translation of statement issued today following discussion by the Italian Cabinet.
"The Italian Government is following with closest attention the situation that has been created with regard to the Suez Canal by laws promulgated by the Egyptian Government nationa- lizing the Suez Canal Company. The juridical aspects of the question also concern the question of freedom of communication, now existing and internationally guaranteed, between the Mediterranean and the Red Sea, which is a vital line of transit for Italy. In the present situation the Italian Government cannot but express its anxiety for any possible harm to the Italian economy, to Italian shipping companies or to private citizens that might arise should the conditions hitherto in force for traffic through the canal be altered".
